Letter from the President

Thanks to everyone who joined us for the 127th Founders' Day at The Ranch. It was a beautiful day with nearly 50 sisters, including Epsilon Gamma, celebrating our founding and sisterhood. We raised over \$550 for the Ruby Fund to assist sisters in need and collected 30 stuffed pandas for the Arthritis Foundation's JA Summer Camp and recognized two sisters for their dedication to AOII: Emery Smith received the Edith Cope Lockard Life Loyal Scholarship and Jean Nelson received the DAC Sisterhood Award.

At Founders' Day, I was thrilled to announce that the DAC has formed a national committee to create a Tracy Maxwell Let Your Light Shine Scholarship. Our goal is to establish an endowment fund that will allow the AOII Foundation to award an annual scholarship in Tracy's honor. \$2500 will be awarded to a sister who embodies Tracy's drive to shine a light on world issues (like hazing) and endeavors to create change in the future. The DAC has made an initial pledgeof \$1000 and a matching gift of \$750. Look for more details in your inbox when the fundraising campaign officially kicks off on February 20th.

- In addition to volunteering at Newborns in Need with Panhellenic and our trail cleanup, we actively supported other initiatives:

- Raised \$750 in November with our Butter Braids campaign, which has been dedicated to the Tracy Maxwell Let Your Light Shine Scholarship Fund
- Team Panda raised \$2000 at the Jingle Bell Run
